Targa Trofeo 2026 | Guide to the Event (V1.0)



About the Event

Targa Trofeo is a three-day event that sits within Targa Tasmania, one of the world's last iconic motoring events. Held in November over three days on the beautiful and remote island of Tasmania, the event offers everything from a rally competition in the tradition of Targa Florio and the Mille Miglia, through to a spirited driving experience in the Targa Tour designed for those who want to simply enjoy their vehicles on some of the best roads you could ever imagine.

With 24 sections of road closed to the public, Targa Trofeo offers entrants the chance to experience a taste of the *'Ultimate Tarmac Rally'*.



Event Overview

Targa Trofeo 2026 will be based out of Launceston for the duration of the event.

Competition Arrival

Competitors will need to arrive into Launceston by 8am on 16 November to begin pre-event documentation, vehicle checks and attend the Targa Academy.

Tour Arrival

Tour participants will need to arrive into Launceston by 8am on 17 November to undertake all pre-event documentation and vehicle checks, with a compulsory safety briefing to be attended by all participants prior to the start of the event.

Targa Travel

For many years, people attending Targa Tasmania have wanted to simply have everything sorted for them - from the moment they leave home to come to Tasmania and back again.

Targa Travel is a new one-stop bespoke service that will book and manage everything for you for Targa Tasmania, along with any pre-event trips you make to undertake reconnaissance.

We can also provide a travel service to your family and friends, along with spectators wishing to travel to the event.

Targa Trofeo - Competition

The Targa Tasmania competition category offers you the chance to challenge yourself against the clock on closed public roads through the island's scenic landscapes.

The event features both modern, early modern and classic cars competing in timed special stages, covering challenging and varied terrain. With the goal of completing every Targa stage within the "Trophy Time" and earning a Targa Trophy, Targa Tasmania attracts crews from around the world and is considered one of the most iconic and challenging tarmac rallies globally.

Targa Tasmania is an invitation only event, and competitors wishing to receive an invitation are required to complete an application form nominating the crew and their chosen vehicle. This application requests details of the crew's previous experience at Targa Tasmania, as well as other relevant motorsport experience to determine competition eligibility.

Once the application has been reviewed by the Targa Tasmania eligibility panel, an 'Invitation to Compete' will be issued for the category the eligibility panel deems most suitable based on the experience level of the crew.

Targa Trofeo - Competition

Categories

TSD Trophy

This entry level competition is reserved for all vehicles manufactured from 1948 up to 2026. It allows speed limited (130km/h) time, speed, distance (regularity style) competition between vehicles of many ages and engine sizes with crew skill, mechanical performance and reliability determining the outcome. Vehicles must be compliant for normal road registration and road usage including any modifications that have been made to the vehicle.

The primary goal of TSD is to complete each Targa stage as close to the issued target time as possible. Penalty points are allocated for time taken above or below the target time, and the crew with the lowest penalty point score at the end of the competition is declared the winner.

This category is a great option for entrants without approved motorsport experience to try Targa Tasmania without the need for extensive vehicle modifications as no safety cage is required.

Trophy

The Trophy category is the next step in the Targa Tasmania competition, where vehicles are split into three competition categories. Crews compete against the clock up to a maximum speed of 140km/h. The crew with the lowest accumulated penalty time in each category is declared the competition winner.

This level of competition is available for entrants who have previous approved motorsport experience and wish to compete at Targa Tasmania but do not yet meet the experience requirements for the Supercup competition, who wish to experience the event at a reduced outright speed. A minimum of a half safety cage is required to the standards outlined in the Technical Regulations.

Supercup

The Supercup category is highest level in the Targa Tasmania competition, where vehicles are split into three competition categories (see below). Crews compete against the clock up to a maximum speed of 190km/h. The crew with the lowest cumulative time in each category is declared the competition winners along with the crew with the lowest accumulated penalty time of these crews being declared the overall winners of Targa Tasmania.

Competitors in this category are required to have previous Targa Tasmania experience that meets the eligibility criteria as set out in the Terms & Conditions. A full safety cage is required to the standards outlined in the Technical Regulations.

Competitions

Within Targa Tasmania competition there are three competition types within the Trophy and Supercup categories and vehicle eligibility is determined by the year of manufacture of the vehicle being entered.

Classic

Vehicles manufactured between 1 January 1948 and 31 December 1988 are eligible for 'Classic' competition classes.

Early Modern

Vehicles manufactured between 1 January 1989 and 31 December 2007 are eligible for 'Early Modern' competition.

Modern

Vehicles manufactured between 1 January 2008 up to 2026 are eligible for 'Modern' competition.

Targa Trofeo Competition Eligibility

Targa Trofeo - Tour

In the Targa Tasmania Tour, participants experience a true tarmac rally in a non-competitive, non-timed format, and without the need to install safety equipment to your car.

Enjoying the same challenging, closed-road stages as the competition cars at speeds of up to 130km/h, the Targa Tour delivers the exhilaration of driving your car as it was designed, without the pressure of competition, on some of the country's best and most exciting roads, while enjoying one of Australia's premier tourism destinations.

Entering the Tour

Targa Tasmania is an invitation only event. All Tour participants wishing to receive an invitation are required to submit a 'Application for Entry' form via our website.

Preparing for the Tour

Clothing Requirements

Participants must wear non-synthetic clothing with neck to wrist to ankle cover and closed flat shoes whilst driving through Targa stages. Clothing of synthetic materials are not permitted.

Crew Requirements

Each vehicle must have both a Driver and Co-Driver at all times. Vehicles with less, or more, than two crew members will not be permitted to drive on the Targa stages.

Licence Requirements

Both Driver & Co-Driver are required to hold a valid and unrestricted civil drivers licence that is recognised in Tasmania.

Road Books

Road books provide comprehensive details of the course and will be issued to participants at documentation prior to event start. It is important that at least one crew member be able to read a road book, particularly on touring stages. The use of stage notes is prohibited in the Targa Tour. Crews found using pace notes will be excluded from the Targa Tour immediately.

Course

Travelling along the same route as the competition vehicles, the tour is grouped into 'packets' of up to 15 vehicles and led by our experienced Targa Tour Leaders. The Tour Leaders are there to assist your driving pleasure and match you up with like-minded Tour participants.

Start Order

The Tour Leader may change the order of, and/or within, a tour packet at any time. Refusal to follow the instructions of the Tour Leader will see the participant not start the next or any proceeding stages.

Reporting for the Days Activites

Participants are required to report to the departure point no less than 45 minutes before their time of departure and prepare to leave when instructed to do so by the Tour Leader.

Blue Chip

A Blue Chip is required by all participants at Targa Tasmania. To receive a Blue Chip, participants must provide all required documentation and attend the pre-event safety briefing.

Targa Trofeo - Tour

Targa Stages

Tour vehicles drive on the same closed roads as the competition. Within the closed-road Targa stages, normal safe driving practices must be followed, however, as the roads are closed there will be no oncoming traffic, allowing you to use both sides of the road.

During the Targa Stages you are permitted to drive up to a maximum speed of 130km/h, however you must revert to the normal signposted speed limits after slowing to exit the Targa stage.

Vehicle Requirements

A vehicle wishing to participate in a Targa Tour must be roadworthy at all times and equipped with the following:

- **Two Safety Triangles**
- **First Aid Kit**
- **At least one tow point** - either front and/or rear
- **Oil absorbent material:** Participants are required to carry in their vehicle a 1kg bag of environmentally friendly, 100%organic, non-leaching, biodegradable oil absorbent material (this may be Kitty Litter) or 500g of specialist absorbent material.
- **Tyres** must be road legal (no R-Spec or Semi Slicks allowed) and maintain a tread depth above the wear indicators at all times.
- **Fire Extinguisher:** It is highly recommended but not compulsory to securely fit a correctly maintained hand-held fire extinguisher with a total capacity of not less than 1.0kg

You will not require:

- A roll cage
- Race seats or harnesses
- Helmets

RallySafe

RallySafe is a mandatory GPS safety device used on all Targa stages.

All Tour vehicles will be required to fit a RallySafe device to their vehicle, and Targa will supply a Temporary RallySafe Fitting Kit prior to the event, and the RallySafe Unit will be supplied at pre-event Documentation.

It is the responsibility of the entrant to ensure the Temporary Installation Kit is fitted per the Rally-Safe instructions prior to arriving at the Pre-Event Safety check.



Entry Fees

Competition Entry Fees

Entry fees for Targa Trofeo 2026 are listed below.

- **2026 Early Bird Entry Fee** (until June 30 2026) **\$ 7,950 (incl. GST)**
- **2026 Regular Entry Fee** **\$ 8,750 (incl. GST)**

A deposit of \$1,500 is payable within 14 days of invoice to secure your entry. Early Bird entries close June 30 2026, after which time the Regular Entry Fee will apply. Please refer to the Terms & Conditions for more information.

Tour Entry Fees

- **2026 Early Bird Entry Fee** (until June 30 2026) **\$4,450 (incl. GST)**
- **2026 Regular Entry Fee** **\$4,950 (incl. GST)**

A deposit of \$1,000 is payable within 14 days of you receiving the invoice to secure your entry. Early Bird entries close June 30 2026, after which time the Regular Entry Fee will apply. Please refer to the Terms & Conditions for more information.

All Targa Trofeo entry fees include:

- Access to 24 stages of closed roads for your driving enjoyment
- Insurance coverage as outlined in the terms and conditions
- Lunch for two people on five days of the event
- Two welcome party and two celebration function tickets
- Targa Trofeo event decals
- RallySafe Equipment hire for the event, including a temporary fitting kit and RallySafe Unit
- Overnight secure parking (optional for Tour participants)
- Multiple vehicle expos to display your vehicle and sponsors (optional for Tour participants)
- Towing service back to the overnight stop, when required
- Recovery bus service back to the overnight stop, when required

Win a Free Entry to Targa Tasmania 2027!

All Targa Trofeo entrants will have the chance to win a free entry to Targa Tasmania 2027.

The outright winning crew will be awarded a free 2027 Competition entry at Targa Tasmania, while an additional Competition crew and one Targa Tour crew will each receive a free entry for their respective classes via a lucky draw from all eligible crews participating in Targa Trofeo.

Simply taking part in Targa Trofeo this year could secure your place at the Ultimate Tarmac Rally in 2027.
